Masters of Laws, is a research assistant at the Department of Administrative Law of the Institute of Law Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences. He is the author of several dozen scientific publications on administrative proceedings with particular emphasis on the issue of electronic communication.

Judicial System in Poland with Specific Characteristics of Administrative Dispute

The lecture will cover the topic of the Polish judicial system, including its constitutional foundations and the characteristics of administrative justice. It will examine the roles of the Supreme Court and the Supreme Administrative Court in providing guidance for the proper interpretation of legal norms. The lecturer will also discuss the legal basis on which administrative courts are to adjudicate disputes. Moreover, the lecture will address the right to an administrative court as a specific category and its compliance with international standards.

Selected Issues in Polish General Administrative Proceedings: Electronic Communication, Artificial Intelligence and Automatic Decisionmaking

The second lecture will cover various aspects of the general administrative procedure in Poland. The lecture will mainly focus on discussing the general principles and the proceedings' course. Additionally, the parties' right to an appeal and the possibility of waiving this right, which has caused some dilemmas in Polish administrative procedural law, will be covered. Furthermore, the lecture will highlight the role of interpretation by administrative courts. The use of electronic service, which has been established as the primary method of service in Poland after a recent reform, will also be addressed. Finally, the lecture will conclude with a reflection on the legal admissibility of using artificial intelligence and algorithm-based automatic decision-making in administrative proceedings.

Dr. Giulia Mattioli

is a researcher in administrative law at the Department of Economics and Management, University of Ferrara. She teaches administrative, public, and public economic law. Her research focuses on transport sector regulation, public contracts, undertakings, and services. She practiced law for over ten years, specialising in administrative law.

System of Administrative Justice in Italy

The lecturer will analyse the structure and guidelines of the administrative justice system in Italy. On this basis, a critical assessment will be made of the role of the administrative judge in balancing the positive and negative circumstances that may affect administrative litigation as a space for guaranteeing individual rights and protecting the public interest.
