About the Straniak Academy

The Straniak Academy for Democracy and Human Rights was recently established by the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute of Human Rights – Research Association in Vienna in cooperation with the Faculties of Law, Sociology and Political Science of the Universities of Vienna and Montenegro. The realisation of the Academy could be achieved with the valuable support in particular of the Hermann and Marianne Straniak Foundation, and other sponsors. The Academy will take place for the first time from 8 to 21 September 2013 in the wonderful historic city of Budva on the Montenegrin coast.



Aim of the Academy

The goal of the Academy is to promote academic tuition on democratisation and human rights in Southeast European States and to create a bridge between academia and practice, promoted through an interdisciplinary and interactive format.

Concept and Programme

Thirty students from the region and EU member states will have the unique opportunity to work with experienced

professors, practitioners and regional and international experts and to discuss important issues on democracy and human rights. Lessons will be held in the morning and in the afternoon, followed by evening discussions and round tables. There will also be enough time to enjoy the sea and to explore the Montenegrin coast!

Certificates and credits

Students will get a certificate of the Academy. The participating University Faculties will decide on the respective credits to be awarded.

Application and Fees

The participation fee is EUR 75 for students and new graduates from Southeast European States and EUR 150 from EU and other States. Accommodation including breakfast (in Hotel Mogren, Budva) will be covered by the Academy.
