#### Introduction

The conference organized in the beautiful Balatonfüred (next to the Tihany peninsula) at the shore of Lake Balaton gives a perfect opportunity to broaden your world view, get a new outlook on current issues and enjoy the last days of summer among international students interested in foreign affairs. The goal of the event is to create a common approach towards the historical and cultural complexity of Central Eastern Europe. This year's topic will be Elections to the European Parliament and the future of the EU.

During the seminar we will study the historical, cultural and political reasons of differences and similarities between the countries of the region. Hopefully we will be able to highlight the importance of the common origins and causes of general misunderstandings. We will examine the motives of conflicts and the prospects of cooperation.

With the help of our experts, participants will be able to discover cultural differences and similarities just as well as different history prospective within the region. The concept of the conference is to combine the lectures of professionals with workshops and presentations of the participants. During the workshops all those taking part in the program will have the chance to draw lessons from the lectures, to expand their own views and to discuss them with fellow participants in small groups mentored by experts.

Besides the examination of the mentioned topics, there will be a big emphasis on getting to know each other personally and professionally as well through teambuilding activities, workshops and simulations.

Since Hungary is very much centralized to Budapest we think that everybody visiting Hungary must get at least a little insight from the beautiful capital city of the country. Before or after our seminar there will be also possible to stop by in Budapest too.

In addition, Tihany Center for Political Analysis is offering the possibility of publishing scientific articles and participation in its intern program for the best participants. The first step of the recruitment process will be one mandatory essay (2-3 pages long) written by the participants prior the conference. These essays besides the recruitment will serve the preparation of the participants as well. The second step is to prepare a presentation about certain topics, which will be shown before or during the summer seminar.
