Content (Syllabus outline):

This course will cover the basics of American Bankruptcy Law, including eligibility to file, exemptions, claims, and liens. It will include the trustee's powers to avoid transcations and transfers.
Introduction; history of bankruptcy law; structure of the Bankruptcy Code.
Debt collection practices; secured transactions; eligibility requirements; voluntary bankruptcy.
Involuntary bankruptcy.
Appointment of trustee; property of the estate
Exemptions. Exemption planning; avoiding liens on exempt property.
Avoiding liens on exempt property (cont.); the automatic stay.
<i>Terminating the automatic stay;</i> <i>use and sale of estate property; cash collateral.</i>
Assumption or rejection of executory contracts and unexpired leases.
Avoiding powers; avoiding post-petition transfers; avoiding preferential transfers.
Avoiding fraudulent conveyances.
Unsecured claims; priorities; distribution rules.
Secured claims; redemption; reaffirmation; strong arm powers.
Denial of discharge; dischargeability of debts.

Prof. Dr. Burton will prepare materials for the students to read, as well as weekly quizzes. Some of the readings will be from Bankruptcy (5th edition) by Jordan, Warren & Bussel (Foundation Press); The Elements of Bankruptcy by Douglas G. Baird (Foundation Press; and of course the Bankruptcy Code and Rules (Law School Edition)(West).

	My objective is for the students to learn the basics of US Bankruptcy Law so that they will understand what can happen in a bankrupty case in the US and how the claims process works.

Znanje in razumevanje:	Knowledge and understanding of the basics of US Bankruptcy Law, including how to read and interpret bankruptcy statutes; how to file a claim; what »rights« a creditor may lose in a bankrtypy case; what powers the trustee is given over the debtor's property; which debts can be »discharged« (forgiven) and which can't; so that they will understand what can happen in a bankrupty case in the US and how the claims process works. They will learn how to interpret American statutes and case law, and also the substance of the law.
